IIJA Expires Sept. 30, 2026


Right in the middle of the mid-term elections

Progress underway in EPW, with Banking starting to engage.



Molinaro Takes the Helm

Former Congressman Marcus Molinaro (R-NY) was named FTA Administrator in August. Focus on outcomes, accessibility and innovation.

FY 2025

Finalized in March with slight increases to transit; follows IIJA

FY 2026


Transit and the Big Beautiful Bill, potential appropriations delays President's Budget

THE VALUE OF NON-RIDERS


Support from the parts of the community that do not ride is essential to success

Productive and engaged board




